





MEDITATION

"Brigit was a form of the sun Goddess, and her symbolism remains attached to the sun in the form of Brigit's crosses.....found throughout the world as sun symbol probably reached Ireland originally sometime between the second century BCE and the second century CE. Brigit crosses are still used in parts of Ireland today to protect the harvest and the farm animals. In the Christian "Lives" of Brigit there are numerous references to her association with the sun. Her mother a slave, " ... went at sunrise with a vessel full of milk in her hand, and when she put one of her two footsteps over the threshold of the house, the other foot being inside, then she brought forth her daughter, ever Saint Brigit." As an infant, her mother left her in the house on her own. While she was away, the neighbors saw flames rising form the house and rushed to it, thinking it was on fire. Instead, the baby slept peaceful in her crib, and then came to the conclusion that she was full of the "grace of the holy Spirit." She is said to have hung her cloak on the rays of the sun...... 
But if I live And should you die for Ireland Let not your dying thoughts Be just of me But say a prayer to God for our dearest Island I know He'll hear and help to set her free



We pray for all creatures in, over, and underground our common home: the plants and animals, the wind, the fire, earth and water. Please help us help you and save the earth. Amen




